


WEBINAR RECAP: OT IN EARLY CHILDHOOD - PLAY-BASED INTERVENTIONS

SPOTLIGHT ON LEADERSHIP: AN INTERVIEW WITH MS SHAHIDDA ZAKIR KHAN

(PRESIDENT POTA)

We are excited to share insights from our recent interview with Ms Shahidda Zakir Khan, the **esteemed President of the Pakistan Occupational Therapy Association (POTA)** and **Head of the Department of Occupational Therapy at the Sindh Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (SIPMR)**. Her remarkable journey and contributions to the field of occupational therapy are truly inspiring.

Ms Shahidda Khan's introduction to occupational therapy was a serendipitous encounter that ignited her passion for the field. During a hospital visit to support a colleague who had been injured, she observed a group of professionals working intensively with patients. Curious about their roles and realizing they were not nurses; she discovered the field of occupational therapy. This moment of realization led her to pursue studies in a profession that was not widely recognized in Pakistan at the time.


The mother of Occupational Therapy, Ma'am Nighat Lodhi laid the foundations of Occupational Therapy in the 70's as a single person where she started from developing a diploma which was later given the status of a degree endorsed by University of Karachi. Ms Shahidda believes her biggest inspiration was Ms Lodhi, and that it was her commitment, persistence and passion that further led to the journey of accreditation and affiliation with WFOT.

In **1992**, Ms Lodhi attended WFOT's meeting for the very **first time** and developed an understanding about curriculum advancement for OT education.

In **1996**, Ms Lodhi got the **curriculum approved** for OT education for the first time in Pakistan. Their efforts bore fruit and POTA became a **full member of WFOT in 1996**.

Occupational therapy is a comprehensive client-centered rehabilitation and treatment model that addresses both the physical and mental well-being of patients. This type of therapy covers various aspects of a patient's life, such as work, education, self-care, and leisure.

In mental health settings, occupational therapy helps individuals envision a more positive outlook on life and their potential. It focuses on creating goal-directed activities that enable clients to fulfill the expectations of their personal and professional roles.

The role of occupational therapy in mental health places a strong emphasis on holism, function, participation, and partnership to aid individuals with mental health issues in developing coping skills, engaging in daily activities, and achieving their recovery goals.

The three core elements of occupational therapy are assessments, individual therapy, and group therapy.

Mental health recovery through occupational therapy interventions includes structured tasks, daily living skills, expressive activities, social skills training, coping skills training, vocational training, relaxation techniques, and psychoeducation.





Mental health occupational therapists achieve these outcomes by collaborating with individuals and communities to improve their ability to engage in desired, necessary, or expected activities, as well as by adjusting the activities or environment to better support their engagement.

THE VITAL ROLE OF DOCUMENTATION IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

The healthcare system in Pakistan consists of two main systems: the public sector and the private sector. According to Khan, S.J. et al. (2023), the Pakistan Healthcare System (PHS) serves a population of over 220 million within the country. However, the system faces challenges, leading to issues across all areas of healthcare, including occupational therapy.

Occupational therapy services in Pakistan are not new, but there is a lack of emphasis on documentation. Occupational therapy practice must pay careful attention to documentation record-keeping, and particularly in Pakistan. Documentation serves as legal and official evidence of the services provided, allowing practitioners to justify their actions and decision-making when necessary. Additionally, maintaining accurate records ensures continuity of care clients. especially when multidisciplinary team is involved.

documentation Furthermore, allows occupational therapists to monitor their patients' progress, evaluate the success of their interventions, and adjust treatment facilitates programs. lt also clear communication therapists, between patients, and other medical professionals, enablina the exchange information about the patient's condition and treatment plan, which is essential for interdisciplinary cooperation.

In addition, standardised record-keeping supports data collection for research, which is crucial in a developing field like occupational therapy in Pakistan. Evidence-based practices can help the profession advance and advocate for improved tools and regulations.

In conclusion, meticulous documentation and record-keeping are essential for good practice, as they ensure legal and professional integrity, enhance patient care, encourage teamwork, and contribute to the advancement of the occupational therapy sector in Pakistan.

George R. Terry defines Management as a distinct process consisting of planning, organizing, actuating, and controlling, performed to determine and accomplish the stated objective using human beings and other resources. Therefore, Effective time management is a **key skill** that significantly impacts personal and professional success.

Managing time leads to different benefits such as it enhances productivity. 
